Supplemental Educational Services

Dear Parents,

Your child may be eligible to receive Supplemental Educational Services (SES)—extra academic assistance (tutoring) that the school will provide to help your child improve his or her academic performance—free of charge except for transportation costs. If you choose to enroll your child, you will be able to select a program that best fits your child's needs. We are giving you this notice to help you understand how SES tutoring can help your child and what you must do to take advantage of it.

These services are above and beyond what the school already offers its students. We are currently providing an after school program that your student may attend, but the program does not qualify as an Arkansas Department of Education approved supplemental education service provider.

On the next two pages is a list of the providers that have been approved by the state to offer services to your child. Please note that these are the only providers that have been approved at this time. Determination of SES Services
Title I - Schoolwide

I. Students may be enrolled in SES Services if they meet the following requirement:

The student is from a low-income family (as determined by free or reduced lunch status). This student does not have to be a member of a subgroup that that did not make AYP, and does not have to be in a grade that takes the statewide assessments required by Section 1111 of the ESEA.

II. If more students apply than there are slots available, the following guideline will be followed:

The student who is the lowest achieving in a subject area that resulted in the school being identified for improvement, corrective action, or restructuring, will be provided services first.

III. If slots are still open after all other eligible applicants have been placed, priority will be given to:

The student who has the greatest need economically and who is at greatest risk academically

- ❖ A prioritized list of students will be placed on a waiting list for services in the event an enrolled student drops out.

As of October 1, 2010, 190 students qualify for SES services at the Drew Central High School. Enrollment forms were received from the parents of ten students; one parent decided against tutoring; and two students actually attended SES tutoring.
